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**5300.60 VISITORS TO THE SCHOOLS**

1. The purpose of this Code of Conduct is to establish a set of standards for the conduct of all visitors to the schools. The standards are intended to ensure that all visitors to the schools are treated with respect and dignity, and that the schools are a safe and secure environment for all students and staff.

2. This Code of Conduct applies to all visitors to the schools, including parents, family members, community members, and other guests. It is the responsibility of all visitors to read and understand this Code of Conduct, and to adhere to its provisions at all times.

3. The standards of conduct outlined in this Code of Conduct are intended to be fair and reasonable, and to promote a positive and productive environment for all visitors to the schools. Visitors who violate these standards may be subject to disciplinary action, including suspension of access to the schools.

4. The standards of conduct outlined in this Code of Conduct are intended to be consistent with the policies and procedures of the district, and with the laws and regulations of the state and federal government.

5. The standards of conduct outlined in this Code of Conduct are intended to be enforceable, and to provide a clear and consistent basis for disciplinary action.

6. The standards of conduct outlined in this Code of Conduct are intended to be reviewed and updated periodically, as needed, to reflect changes in the district's policies and procedures, and in the laws and regulations of the state and federal government.

7. The standards of conduct outlined in this Code of Conduct are intended to be a living document, and to be subject to change and improvement over time.

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**5300.65 PUBLIC CONDUCT ON SCHOOL PROPERTY**
