DataSecurity and Privacy Policy

The Board shall designate a Data Protection Officer ("DPO") who will be responsible for the implementation of the policies and procedures required under Education Law §2d and its accompanying regulations. The Board adopts the National Institute for Standards and Technology Cybersecurity Francework Version 1.1 (NIST CSF) for data security and protection. The District's DPO is responsible for ensuring the District complies with its obligations to implement data safegrards in compliance with NIST CSF and Education Law §2.d.

A. Compliance with Law
